The Family of Tang Soo Do

Amazed but not surprised! The World Tang Soo Do Association reached its 42nd birthday on November 13, 2024, with convincing evidence that Cho Dae Kwan Chang Nim Shin's vision for a world-wide Tang Soo Do organization was prescient, well-conceived, thoughtfully planned, and eminently durable. He drew his initial inspiration for a new Association from working with former students at Osan Air Base in South Korea until 1968, and later with instructors and students in the USA for the next 14 years until the day the WTSDA was chartered in 1982.

He worked tirelessly from his small office in Philadelphia and managed his dream Association with a very small headquarters' staff. To ensure new growth and continuity, he traveled frequently to those initial WTSDA regions. He appointed volunteer directors, designated committees with assigned chairs, and secured support from the general membership.

Little has changed from his management philosophy these past 42 years. The Association has enlarged the volunteer management structure as it added more countries, created new regions, and enrolled additional members. CDKCN Shin's idea was to engage a loyal volunteer membership to help manage the Association beyond the small staff at headquarters. It was foresight that encouraged this brilliant decision to involve the membership in regional management and special committees at both the regional and Association level.

He reasoned that members/students would be learning Tang Soo Do, but some could also offer their other skills, for example, in technology, law, medicine, education, management, artwork, architecture and publishing. In addition to training, they could contribute to the health and sustainability of the larger Association. History reveals that from the birth of the Association, many members have volunteered, or asked to contribute, and have done it with eagerness and substantial energy. CDKCN Shin started us on this path, but the senior Masters have continued forging ahead, setting the example for all of us to follow. Through their efforts, we've created a culture of contribution that is part of the fabric of our Association.

CDKCN Shin's excitement about the Association, coupled with his incredible teaching of Tang Soo Do and diplomatic skills, and his frequent annual visits to members in regions across the world, engendered a feeling of belonging to something special, indeed to a multicultural "family" that proudly identified with the traditions that he espoused.

During this past year, I traveled to many regions, attended the three Masters' Clinics, the USA, European, and Latin American, assisted with several Black Belt camps and clinics, and helped host the 2024 World Championship. At all venues, I recognized the expressed excitement of belonging to such a professional and welcoming Association. Mothers, fathers, significant others and members of all ages and ranks, spoke positively about the effects of Tang Soo Do training for themselves, their family members and the community. CDKCN Shin would be proud to know that his dream is alive and well, and that his idea of a mostly volunteer organization is working admirably to help manage and grow the "Family" of Tang Soo Do.

Many thanks to everyone for continuing to support our outstanding World Tang Soo Do Association!

Kudos to the WTSDA IT Team



For this issue, I am highlighting the fine work our IT Team continues to do regarding WTSDA website design and development. The team consists of Masters Paul Maguire (team lead), Pat West, Nicole Peterman, Juanya Williams, myself, and Misters Gideon Lee, John Fletcher, Andres Rojas, and Ron Russak. With meetings every-other week, this all-volunteer team discusses, plans, creates, tests and implements new capabilities allowing for more efficiency and increased user engagement of the website. In 2024, the new site went LIVE with a totally new look. An emphasis was placed on user-friendliness and streamlining tasks performed by studio owners and chief instructors. Additionally, HQ benefits from new processes that help staff manage work related to Gup and Dan testing, as well as supply orders. The capability now

exists to track judging certification and allows for the printing of the certificate right from the website. At the end of 2024, the new Shopping Cart was made available. This took many months to implement, and we hope that instructors will utilize the Cart instead of emailing HQ staff with orders. If you haven't yet, please check it out!

Here is a list of things to expect in 2025 from the IT Team:

- Instructor Continuing Education Videos will be available at no cost to our members.
- The ability to easily check your student list for those who should be listed as 'inactive'.
- The ability to add new members (individually and in bulk) with an on-line WTSDA Membership
 Application that will also include Gup testing requirements and wavier, so Gup test applications no longer
 need to be signed by student or parent before each test.
- Email notification from HQ for test submissions.

The IT Team continues its work, and we look forward to new capabilities in 2025!





2024 World Championship Clinics

The World Championship Clinics began in 2018 with a proposal to Grandmaster Beaudoin. The kernel of the idea was to further enhance the World Championship experience for the participants. Many participants and their families arrive a few days before the competition begins. This pre-competition time is a perfect opportunity to give these participants the opportunity to take class directly from the Association's Ko Dan Ja. With the approval of Grandmaster Beaudoin, a new tradition was begun.

The 2024 World Championship Clinics have built of the success of the past events. Throughout the day on Thursday, July 11th we were able to offer 21 different training sessions lasting 1-2 hours each. Remembrances of a Friend and Tang Soo Do Grandmaster Jerry Stine



My earliest memory of this extraordinary man and Tang Soo Do martial artist dates to the first US Masters' Clinic at the St. Leo's Abbey in the spring of 1990. It was my first time to meet and train with most of the Masters, including Master Jerry Stine. He was my senior by Dan # 14288 and the second lowest Dan number at the clinic.

We did not get much sleep at this USMC. Grandmaster Shin worked us from 6:00 am until late each night and we often stayed up longer getting to know each other. It was a bonding

experience and one that I quickly recognized in the van on the way to the airport on Sunday afternoon. I fell asleep, but suddenly awoke with someone sleeping on my shoulder, Master Stine! A remarkably quick friendship!

We continued to see each other during the next 34 years at Tang Soo Do and other events. He was a traveler and frequent guest instructor in many regions, including Mexico, Costa Rica and Chile. On some of my geography trips, he stayed with me where we enjoyed walking the streets of San Francisco and Santa Ana, Costa Rica, among other places. On many occasions, we shared our knowledge and skills with our Tang Soo Do members, and perhaps our last time together at a Region 1 event in May 2024. At that time, he was suffering a foot injury but nevertheless maintained his presence and offered significant advice on advanced training details.

We shared many memorable training experiences. He was quick, strong, imaginative, and enjoyed continuous fighting action. It was my good fortune to be his partner at both our 6th and 7th Dan tests. I keenly remember one segment of our 7th Dan test. Grandmaster Beaudoin announced floor fighting for each pair. Instead of just punch, strike and retreat, instinctively we counter attacked each other continuously back and forth, rolling around on the floor until we finally decided to stop. We looked up to see that others had stopped and were watching us!

When Grandmaster Shin appointed me as TAC chair in 1995, I appointed Grandmaster Stine Chair of the Hyung subcommittee where he provided his vast knowledge and understanding of hyung for training and for CDKCN Shin's books. He researched and wrote the chapter on Wun Shu in Vol VI *The Master's Training Text*. At an early Masters' Clinic in Alabama, Master Mike Kaye produced a video of us, side-by-side, demonstrating Jion hyung to use in preparing Masters for the demo at the next World Championship.

Grandmaster Stine honored me by assisting in my Ku Dan promotion. As a professional courtesy, he ceremonially removed my old belt at my 9th Dan, Kwan Chang Nim ceremony at the Region 8 Kalahari events on October 9, 2021. A few years later, I had the honor of presenting him with his 8th Dan, Boo Kwan Chang Nim belt at the World Championship. Grandmaster Stine created a remarkable legacy, a legacy woven into the very fabric of our community. He was a master of technique and a true sage of the martial way. His journey was one of discipline, humility, and unwavering commitment to the World Tang Soo Do Association.

Grandmaster Stine taught us that martial arts is more than just physical prowess; it is a path of self-discovery, resilience, and honor. He believed in the power of the human spirit, always encouraging us to push our limits while fostering respect and compassion for one another.

Through his teachings, he instilled in us the values of perseverance and integrity. Grandmaster Stine inspired countless individuals, transforming not only their technique but also their personal lives.

I fondly remember the countless hours spent training with him, where he guided us with patience and wisdom. Grandmaster Stine was a mentor and a friend. We honor him and carry forward his spirit in every movement we make, every challenge we face, and every person we encounter. May we strive to live with the same passion, dedication, and love of Tang Soo Do that he showed us. A true World Tang Soo Do Warrior!

Memories from Master Jim DeBaca – Jerry Stine and I have been friends for over half a century. Our group which included Grandmasteer Stine, Master Eddie Ramirez, Master Lowe, Master Juan Duffield, Master Don Logan and I trained together all the time while remaining very close friends. Grandmaster Stine began his 'martial arts' with wrestling in his youth then moved onto Korean and Thai styles as well as judo and kickboxing. Grandmaster Stine had an amazing talent for learning forms quickly and making them effective. After one of his trips to Korea, we spent a hot summer day in the garage sweating and videotaping everything he learned. He truly believed in sharing his knowledge and was determined to document it for us and the next generation of martial artist. Several years ago, we transferred those sessions to DVD. Grandmaster Stine's ability to adapt and apply

techniques across the numerous styles was his key to being a well-rounded martial artist. In the 1970s, we were both on a kickboxing intramural team representing USA. We had the opportunity to travel to Alice Springs, Australia to compete. We arrived a few days early to adjust to the time difference. Unfortunately, during that time, Jerry injured his eye, and we weren't sure if he would be able to compete. Surprisingly the day of the competition, he decided to compete, and it was against the best person on the Australian team who was more experienced. In those days, there was no fancy uniforms or facilities. We were dressed in white do bohk pants and a white t-shirt. The ring was a green mat that left green marks on everything that touched it. Grandmaster Stine's techniques was much better than his opponent and he was able to apply his superior takedown ability. At the end of the match, his opponent was green from head to toe including his face and neck. The only way we could describe it to anyone was that his opponent looked like the Jolly Green Giant. Grandmaster Stine's quest for knowledge and his boundless generosity to share it with everyone went above and beyond. I will always remember when someone asked him if he had more to teach his students. His response was "We have stuff to teach that we haven't even thought of yet!"

Memories from Vice President and Master Michael Inoshita - Grandmaster Jerry Stine was one-of-a-kind. He was a legend when I first met him in 1990. His brief conversations about his full contact kick boxing career, technical insights, and encouragement were an inspiration that impacted my training for years. I had the pleasure of sharing the floor with him many times at the Masters' Clinics over the years. He inspired me to be my best self on the floor, in a way only someone who is keeping pace with Masters who were 20 years their junior could.

My favorite memory of training with Grandmaster Stine came around 2010. We were practicing Judo techniques, and he casually said to me. "Hey Mike, do me a favor don't throw me." Which seemed appropriate for a 60+ year old Master to say to a 40-year-old Master. But he felt the need to follow it up with "My doctor doesn't want me falling after my hip replacement, yet." As a physical therapist I knew that people could have problems for many months after a hip replacement. I replied, "Absolutely sir but out of curiosity, when did you have it?" and he answered, "4 weeks ago." Like I said a legend. A few months before he passed Grandmaster Stine came to Region 5 for our regional championship. Despite being at an advanced age and no longer being capable of demonstrating some of the skills himself, he brilliantly shared his knowledge in a way that inspired the students like he had for me 30 years before.

Memories from Master Don Logan - I was very privileged to have trained with Grandmaster Stine for over 30 years. During this time, I learned so much, but also realize he still had so much more he could teach. Grandmaster Stine was not only a great instructor but also became a very good friend. Master Stine was the most humble, kind, and respectful person I have ever met, and he would always treat people as an equal. During the last 20 years, Grandmaster Stine, Master Duffield, and myself did a lot of traveling together (over 200,000 miles).

Besides traveling to the Masters' Clinic, World Championships, and other WTSDA events, we also made trips to Hawaii, but mostly to Cabo San Lucas. For the past 20 years, every December we travel to Cabo San Lucas. Because Grandmaster Stine was so polite and respectful, he was able to make many friends in Cabo San Lucas. After many years of going there, our friends realized that we would be returning every December. However, this past April, there was a solar eclipse in Cabo, so we decided this would be a good excuse to go there early. When we arrived, our friends look confused and asked." why are you here? It's not December". We all had good laugh and went off and partied. As an example of Grandmaster Stine's generosity, he brought with him 25 pairs of solar glasses to hand out to our friends so that they could safely observe the solar eclipse. We had a very enjoyable time there and that's when Grandmaster Stine said that he considered Cabo as his "happy place". Sadly, this was the last time he would be in Cabo.

Memories from Master Juan Duffield - I met Grandmaster Stine in high school, and we were roommates at college. He became a Carpenter Superintendent and worked in construction most of his life. He was a wrestler and a fine wrestling coach for Annalee High School. Jerry got into martial arts at college. Jerry knew Frank Sclarcio, a very tough Black Belt, and started training with him in 1968 in Vietnam. We were young and tried different styles of martial arts. Jerry was team captain for Kick Boxing International. Jerry also had training in judo with Dr. Frank Sclarcio who instructed a few different types of martial arts. Dr. Sclarcio was doing a demonstration at a fairground and asked us to demonstrate sparring. He introduced us as experts, the very best, and let us go. We were on a stage

and were moving around and suddenly, Jerry grabbed a hold of me and threw me off the stage and landed right on top of me. Some experts? We always laughed about that one. He was my friend, my instructor and my brother. I already miss him greatly.

Memories from Master Eddie Ramirez - Grandmaster Stine and I met in 1970 while training with Dr. Frank Sclarcio. It has been a privilege and honor to have a lifelong friendship with Grandmaster Stine, who has inspired and guided me throughout my Tang Soo Do journey. He has always demonstrated his humble and caring support of the WTSDA. We honor the legacy of his abominable spirit committed to our Tang Soo Do family. It is an honor to continue training in memory of Grandmaster Stine. His spirit will always be present.

Memories from Master Becky Wolverton - I knew who Grandmaster Stine was as one of our Senior Masters in Region 1. He was on the panel at all black belt tests and taught at every clinic as I was coming up through the ranks. But he endeared himself to me at my Sam Dan test. As I was an older tester with young men as my other Sam Dan candidates it was obvious I would not be jumping around as they would, however no one said anything when giving instructions. We were doing rolls and falls and were asked to do dive rolls over people. I did the 1-person dive roll easily. Then came the 2-person dive roll and I ran as if I was going to do it and at the last minute moved to the side and came up with a loud kihap. As I was running back to get into line Grandmaster Stine said, "good choice, Ma'am." That's when I knew I liked him.

He was the kind of master that never made you feel bad about what you couldn't do. He was encouraging, supportive and kind. He attended every clinic and Regional Championship in Region 1. During Covid he was supportive of all the Zoom events and classes that we had and attended every single one. There was never a time I heard him refuse to help when asked. Most cases he was already helping in what needed to be done before being asked. Grandmaster Stine taught me how to behave as a Master in the WTSDA. I hope I can live up to his example and continue his legacy of kindness, inclusion and service to our Association. Region 1 will be instituting the Jerry Stine Dedication Award for Dan members and the Gerald Stine Region 1 Scholarship Award of \$3,000.00 on top of the other Region 1 scholarships. These awards will be given annually starting in 2025.

Remembering a Friend - Master Steven Chambliss



It is very fitting that we honor and celebrate the life of Master Steve Chambliss, a remarkable man—a man who touched our lives in so many ways, whose presence brought a special confidence, determination and strength to the martial arts. For those who knew him, they remember his dedication to fitness and training, and how he maintained a powerful physique. From the outside, many saw him as a very serious martial artist, disciplined and focused, always ready for his next challenge in the ring. But to those of us who knew him well, he was so much more than that. He had a great sense of humor, once one got to know him.

Born and raised in Trenton, NJ, he grew up in a community that shaped his character and instilled in him the values of hard work and perseverance. He would tell stories about the trials he faced as a youngster running with the wrong crowd and being tempted to fall into a bad life on the streets. It was in Trenton at a Japanese dojo that Master Chambliss discovered his passion for martial arts, a passion that would come to define much of his life. His journey in Tang Soo Do began when he met CDKCN Shin, who at that time was teaching at the Burlington, N.J. gym, a master who recognized his potential and guided him towards excellence.

Under the mentorship of CDKCN Shin, he dedicated himself to mastering our beautiful art, training tirelessly and pushing himself to new heights. His dedication and hard work paid off, and he went on to win many championships, earning a reputation as an intimidating and formidable fighter. His skills in the ring were unmatched and became recognized by competitors up and down the east coast in the 60s and 70s, as his reputation became synonymous with strength, precision, and excellence. But beyond the accolades and the trophies, it was his spirit and determination that truly set him apart. He approached every challenge with courage and resilience, never backing down and always striving to be the best version of himself. His journey in martial arts was not just about physical prowess; it was a testament to his unwavering commitment to growth and self-improvement.

The many Black Belts he produced over the years are a living testament to his teaching expertise. I did a story for Black Belt Magazine years ago that previewed his daily training routine. It was very extensive, starting with stretching, two hundred sit-ups, and two hundred push-ups and then went on to include many kicks and many, many punches. As we remember Master Chambliss today, let us celebrate the man behind the fighter—the friend who made us laugh, the athlete who inspired us, and the individual who lived his life with passion and purpose. His legacy will live on in the memories we share and the impact he had on our lives.

To quote Master Robinson, "These days terms like legend are used too frequently, but the term fits when speaking of Master Steve Chambliss." He exemplified what a true Tang Soo Do master could be. He will be greatly missed in Region 8 by the family of friends whom he inspired there. He will be remembered as a Charter member of the WTSDA, and as a true giant in the world of martial arts.

Tang Soo! Grandmaster Charles Vaughn



Memories from CEO & President, Master Fattori - Master Chambliss loved the physical nature of Tang Soo Do training and enjoyed other combat arts like boxing and Savate. In class he was always moving, even at times when we were permitted to rest – he had fantastic endurance. During the early days when I was new to the Instructors' Class, I did not engage in conversation with him often, but later, and especially when I became Region 8 Director, he made it a point to speak with me to ask what was going on in the region, and to tell me what a good job I was doing. He had at least two personas; one was of a fierce fighter who would never back-down from a challenge, a traditional and strict instructor, and another, a kind and thoughtful Master who was eager to share his knowledge and love of the art and the people in it. Like many of us, I will miss him but will think of him often when we train. His warrior spirit now needs to live in each of us. Tang Soo Master Chambliss and God bless you.

Memories from Master Kevin Robinson - One of the most exciting things about life is the variety of experiences and people we encounter every day. Some people we meet just once but it makes an impression on us, while others we have the honor of knowing for decades. In my almost 50 years in the martial art of Tang Soo Do I have been fortunate and honored to meet so many wonderful people from all over the world. Many of us in the WTSDA get this opportunity to meet and train with some of the best and most talented Tang Soo Do practitioners to ever study the art. Master Moses Steven Chambliss was one of those Super Stars. When our Association was founded in November 1982, he was one of only 15 Masters at that time to be Charter Members, the majority were of Korean descent. I met Master Chambliss for the first time in 1983 at my Cho Dan test at headquarters in Philadelphia, PA. We were all sitting on the floor waiting for one Master to arrive and I heard someone whisper,

"here comes Master Chambliss." We stood up and in walked the most chiseled in shape martial artist I had ever seen. He was wearing black adidas pants and a white polo shirt. His shoulders were wide, and he had that V taper that fitness athletes strive for. His arms were big and ripped. His face was very serious, and he carried himself with a no-nonsense attitude. I remember thinking, man I hope I get put in the back row away from this guy. They called us up one by one and just my good fortune, I was put in the front row right in front of Master Chambliss who just glared at me. To say he made a major impression on me would be an understatement. In 1985 I was invited to attend a new class at headquarters taught by Grandmaster Shin for Regional studio owners. Master Chambliss was the only Master at that time along with Master Beam. He would come in, get changed and start his warmup. He would walk out of the dressing room and sit on the floor and put his right leg behind his head and sit for a minute or so before putting left leg behind his head. He spoke very little but when he did speak, he was very soft spoken. He led by example in those classes for over 33 years. He trained hard and his speed and power motivated the entire class. He never slowed or showed signs of fatigue while others slowed down or stepped off the floor to catch their breath. His kihap was loud and got your attention. He was one of CDKCN Shin's most loyal and faithful students his entire career. Master Chambliss was also one of the humblest men I have ever met. He accomplished so many great things, but he never talked about himself unless you asked him directly and then he may tell you or he may not. While traveling with Grandmaster Shin one time, he told me a story about Master Chambliss. I wanted to hear the details from Master Chambliss's perspective, so I asked him about it. He shared the story humbly and here it is. One day a man came into the Shin Karate studio after class and challenged Grandmaster Shin to a fight. He was a big guy and said he was a boxer, and he thought Karate was a joke. Grandmaster Shin quietly spoke with the man trying to defuse the situation. The man could not be reasoned with and after a few minutes the guy said he was not leaving until he fought Grandmaster Shin. Master Chambliss was in the back changing to go home. Grandmaster Shin told the man he did not want to fight but if the man could beat one of his students, then he would fight him. The man agreed and Grandmaster Shin yelled "Steven." Master Chambliss had no clue what was going on, but he said, "Yes Sir," and he put his do bohk top back on and walked out to the floor. There was Grandmaster Shin and this guy. Grandmaster Shin explained what was going on and asked Master Chambliss to fight the guy. Master Chambliss said, "yes sir" and the two men squared off. When Grandmaster Shin said go the boxer tried to move forward but Master Chambliss jumped into the air throwing a spinning back kick which landed on the guy's forehead knocking him out cold. I asked him what happened next. He said very matter of fact that they dragged him out the front door and locked it. When I heard the sad news of Master Chambliss's passing it was not just heartbreaking but another loss of epic proportions. The knowledge, skill and the love he had for Tang Soo Do cannot be measured. His dedication, loyalty, sacrifice and commitment to his teacher and the art are legendary. After some tears I was sitting quietly thinking of him and one of my last and fondest memories came to mind. In 2017 a small group of us were inducted into The Philadelphia Historic Martial Arts Society Hall of Fame. I went because Master Godwin told Master Chambliss was being inducted and I could not think of someone more deserving. Master Chambliss was so happy and proud that evening. I was speaking with him after his award later in the evening and he was glowing and stated how special he felt. He had a smile from ear to ear and he said, "here I am tonight, and all my guys are here with me." He was such a humble man yet so powerful! We can all be happy to be considered one of his tribe.

Master Dennis DiMarco - Master Chambliss was my HERO in WTSDA. He was my role model in everything from stretching to techniques to hyung. I don't remember the exact year, but it was at least 25 to 30 years ago at a Black Belt clinic. He was leaning on this fence outside near the football field and I was practicing a form doing my side kick. I thought my side kicks were pretty good. Master Chambliss was watching me and after I was done, he said "you have to put MORE HIP in your kicks". At first, I was a little bummed out, but I knew he was giving me very good constructive criticism meant to make me a better martial artist. I respected his opinion. In tournaments, I would love to be in his ring while judging weapons and hyung. Master Chambliss had an eye for details, and I used him as a gauge to refine my eye for the details. Action is worth a thousand words, and Master Chambliss was all action with little words. Master Chambliss will be missed by every one that knew him. As for me, I will think of all the good memories.

Master John Godwin - I had the privilege of knowing Master Chambliss my entire adult life. He started Tang Soo Do Training in the "Blood and Guts Era" (No pads or protective gear) in the United States with Grandmaster

Jae Chul Shin in Burlington NJ in 1960s. He opened Jade Dragon Karate Institute in Trenton, NJ and maintained active teaching and training for over 50 Years.

I fell in love with martial arts as a teen and enjoyed the competitions and tournaments. I came to know and RESPECT Master Chambliss by meeting him at tournaments. He was a top competitor – Earning many Grand Champion Awards in the 60s & 70s, Second Annual US Grand Champion in 1974 – 1976. He certainly produced top competitors like Master Ismael Roman and Louie Belardo and many others. As a Red Belt, I traveled to Burlington, NJ and watched the Masters Test of Steve Chambliss, James Lee and John Britt. It was a ferocious demanding test, and they certainly were well prepared and performed outstandingly. He was a strong competitor and teacher earning respect for Grandmaster Shin and our WTSDA. We started the regional Instructors Training Class, and the Senior Member was Master Chambliss. He has set the standard for discipline in physical training & conditioning for WTSDA since its beginning in 1982. We have trained together for decades. Master Chambliss became my Kickboxing Instructor in the 1980s. He was sanctioned by the New Jersey boxing commission to promote Kickboxing Competitions in Trenton. Some of the Master Chambliss's Accomplishments.

As martial artists, we train our bodies to move with precision, our minds to stay sharp under pressure, and our spirits to remain steadfast in the face of challenge. But have you ever wondered if there's a deeper connection to explore? One that harmonizes your physical techniques with mental clarity and internal energy.

That's exactly what I discovered when I attended the World Tang Soo Do Championship in 2024. I had been introduced to Ki Gong at my regional Black Belt clinics, but it wasn't until I participated in the Ki Gong workshop before Worlds that I truly understood its power.

Led by Gena Eiseman, the workshop provided insights into the Six Harmonies, the Basic Principles of Mind-Body Unification, and the Three Treasures. These foundational elements gave me a greater appreciation for how Ki Gong isn't just about movement—it's about cultivating a deeper awareness of myself and my energy.

Armed with this new understanding, I applied the breathing techniques and intentional movements I learned during the workshop to my competition the following day. In the past, I often struggled with pre-tournament nerves, and traditional breathing techniques never seemed to fully calm my mind. This time, however, I closed my eyes, focused on my dan jun, and practiced what I had learned. The shift was incredible—while the nerves were still present, they no longer controlled me. I felt more grounded, focused, and ready to perform.

The most surprising result came during sparring, which has always been my biggest challenge. Typically, I find myself reacting rather than responding strategically. But with my newfound calm and focus, I was able to analyze my opponents, adjust my approach, and execute techniques with confidence. For the first time ever, I took home a gold medal in sparring.

Since then, Ki Gong has become a part of my regular routine. I've been practicing at home using Traditional Ki Gong Volume I: Fundamentals as a guide, and I've noticed significant improvements in my overall well-being. Beyond the benefits in my martial arts training, Ki Gong has helped me manage stress and anxiety in my daily life, providing a sense of calm and resilience that extends far beyond the dojang. If you're looking to enhance your Tang Soo Do practice, I encourage you to explore Ki Gong. It offers a unique opportunity to deepen your mind-body connection and unlock potential you may not have realized existed. This was my experience at the World Tournament—what will your experience be at the National Tournament after practicing Ki Gong?

WTSDA Ko Dan Ja Profile – Master Brian Fisher



How and when did you begin your training in Tang Soo Do?

I grew up in South Philly (Philadelphia) about a mile from Shin Karate Institute, in 1985 there was the Karate Kid buzz but also the "Ninja movies" were also going strong at the time, so that added fuel to my interest in martial arts but my parents never really followed up on enrolling me until I had a "run-in" /altercation with some of the older kids who lived on my street, there was no real fighting maybe some teasing, little shoving, taking my hat that sort of thing that motivated my enrollment in class. My parents wanted to make sure I could defend myself if I needed to and learn to control my actions in given situations. At the time I had two good friends who decided to enroll in class, but at the Shin Karate Naval Yard

location which you needed to have access to the Philadelphia Naval Yard at the time, I didn't so I had to go the road alone at Shin Karate Institute, so as a Christmas present that year my parents enrolled me to my very first class with Master John Godwin. My friends at the time lasted about 3 months in their class and here I am all these years later.

Throughout your time with the WTSDA, what different roles and responsibilities have you taken on?

I have been quite fortunate over my martial arts career to have been able to give back and serve in many different capacities to both Shin Karate, Region 8, the WTSDA and my school Oxford Karate Institute. I started my training at Shin Karate in 1985 and eventually took over the role as Chief Instructor, I believe only Master Nate Gordon and I are the only remaining "home grown" students that eventually became Chief Instructor there. I served as the Region 8 Black Belt graduation director for over 20 years and saw many students go from 1st Dan to 4th Dan. I have served as the Region 8 Instructors Club Technical Director, determining what physical training will take place for our instructors. I have been an Arbitrator or Chief Arbitrator for all WTSDA World Championships since 2004 and most Regional and local tournaments. In 2013, Grandmaster Beaudoin reached out to me to assume the role of Technical Advisory Committee Chairmen (TAC) as Grandmaster Strong who had held the role for over 20 years was moving up to fill the role of President in the WTSDA. I gladly and eagerly accepted and have had that role and been a part of the WTSDA Board of Directors since then. Lastly, I have been operating Oxford Karate Institute as a full-time studio since 2004.

As someone deeply involved in the WTSDA, how have you seen the organization evolved over the years?

I think the WTSDA and training in Tang Soo Do has come a long way, there is more focus on health and benefits as compared to some of the "hard-core" training that took place in the past. Instructors have a better grasp of motivational techniques and a better understanding of sports-science and a smart approach to how we train in our classroom. The WTSDA has also grown in many ways, we have been able to share TSD with many more countries and peoples of different cultures over the years and always been welcoming to students of all walks of life. Now in the WTSDA we have many wise individuals from many different fields, not just martial arts, so these many wise voices help contribute to the Board of Directors, Executive & Governance committee to make the best decisions for the current WTSDA and create a stronger WTSDA for many years to come and a bright future for all of us.

Could you share a memorable experience with Grandmaster Shin that has had a lasting impact on your life and practice of Tang Soo Do?

At the original Shin Karate that was upstairs, CDKCN Shin's office was directly located off of the lobby, so every day between 5PM-6PM, 50-60 students would start arriving for class, at the beginning of my training, I wasn't exactly sure who the "Grandmaster" was, I was just told to be sure to bow and show my respect, so during this hour we all stopped upon entering the dojang, knocked and bowed to the Grandmaster in his office, this was his actual office where he is trying to get work done and taking calls, putting out martial arts fires, and doing all things WTSDA. YET, he took the time for every student that stopped to acknowledge them, give us a smile and a "Tang Soo!" as we entered class. After a while and consistent training, when I heard for the first time- "Tang Soo Brian" Wait! What! The Grandmaster knows my name! How about that! I've made sure that even if I have 50 students in a classroom that names are used frequently, and accomplishments are always acknowledged.

When I was an E Dan and an assistant instructor at Shin Karate, I was fortunate enough to travel with him to a different region which also spoke a different language for a Gup clinic & BB testing. The first night after we arrived and settled in there was an informal meet & greet, talk session and one of the participants sort of has this "Aren't you a little too old to be a karate master/grandmaster" question, so Grandmaster Shin was always very gracious and chuckled it off but made his way over to the student with no sort of offensive movements or look on his face but unleashed this lightning fast front kick that startled the student and immediately followed it up with a reverse punch that just tapped the students chest, but could have hit like a freight train had the Grandmaster wanted to. The young man's eyes were as big as the moon and he sheepishly backed away and understood that, yes he could be a real karate master/grandmaster. Even I had a little, "Whoa, don't mess with the Grandmaster!"

What advice would you give to someone to make the most of their journey in Tang Soo Do?

Stay the Course! There are going to be lots of distractions, lots of obstacles, lots of ups and downs during your training, plenty of good times and not so good times. Quite simply don't give up. Let your instructor know when techniques or training is becoming challenging, and they will be there to help guide you and help you regain sight of why you started training. Utilize and embrace your karate relationships, my closest friends at this point in my life are all my martial arts brothers & sisters and I feel a strong bond and connection with all of them. If you stay the course, you'll always be able to accomplish the goals you set for yourself in Tang Soo Do and with the WTSDA.
